Huron Clean Water Project Project Requirements

Community Projects

Cost-share Rate: Up to 50% Maximum Payment: \$2,000

Purpose:

- 1. To provide community groups with funds for stewardship projects that will improve surface and groundwater quality.
- 2. To provide community groups with funds for public educational projects about water quality.

Eligibility:

- 1. Community groups must be established with a board of directors.
- 2. Groups without a board require two members of the group to sign the application.
- 3. Projects must demonstrate water quality benefits.

Eligible Projects:

- 1. Stewardship projects must meet eligibility requirements of specific Best Management Practice category (e.g., Livestock Access Restriction to Watercourses; Fragile Land Retirement; Erosion Control Structures; Clean Water Diversion Wellhead Protection or Decommissioning Unused Wells eligibility requirements).
- 2. Educational projects can be educational materials (videos, publications, posters, etc.) or educational events for the general public.
- 3. The Clean Water Project encourages new projects. Projects will be considered by the Review Committee if the invoice is not older than 6 months at the time of first contact with staff.

Project Details:

- 1. Stewardship projects: See project details for specific Best Management Practice category.
- 2. Educational projects are eligible.
- 3. Clean Water Project to be recognized at the event and/or on promotional materials.

Eligible Costs:

- 1. Stewardship projects: See eligible costs for specific Best Management Practice category.
- 2. Educational projects: Material costs for educational material or events.

Ineligible Costs:

- 1. Stewardship projects: See ineligible costs for specific Best Management Practice category.
- 2. Educational projects: Staffing/labour
- 3. Mileage of group members
- 4. Rental fees for municipality supported or government buildings.
